Class Awards - exercises

We have introduced a choice of some exercises (either/or) in the Grades 1–5 Class Awards. Candidates no longer need to perform all the exercises in the syllabus.

This affects the Techniques 2, 3 and 4 sections. Details of the choices are included in the relevant *Specifications*.

This change takes place with immediate effect. However, we realise that there will be a transition period where some candidates will still perform all exercises. Examiners are aware of this and will accept either the selection, or all exercises, during 2015.

New syllabi

Solo Performance Awards now regulated qualifications!

RAD Solo Performance Awards at Grades 1–5 are now recognised by Ofqual as regulated qualifications.

The new qualifications are on the National Qualifications
Framework (NQF) at Levels 1 and 2.

Solo Performance Awards are 'other general' qualifications, regulated by CCEA in Northern Ireland; this will allow the RAD to maintain recognition by this regulator.

Recognition is important because it means that RAD exams meet standards set by national regulators which report to

Advanced 1 & 2 male syllabi. As with the previous Advanced launch, it will be in virtual (online) format, allowing teachers and students all over the world to participate. The new male syllabi will ensure parity with the female syllabi, and will be examined from January 2016.

The new work will include a solo by Robert Binet, commissioned choreographer for the Genée International Ballet competition 2013, called Open Form. During the launch, members will get an insight into the creation of the solo and the challenges that face young male dancers today, as well as insights from the creative panel on the ethos, choreography and music.

Rosin

Rosin should not be used on dance floors such as Harlequin® and Tarkett®. Such floors are not slippery like wooden floors, and the use of rosin can damage them.

Optional tutu or skirt for vocational graded exams

Female candidates taking vocational graded exams now have the option of wearing a half tutu for Variation 1 and a short skirt for Variation 2 (both available from RAD
